What is the Common Core Standards Initiative?

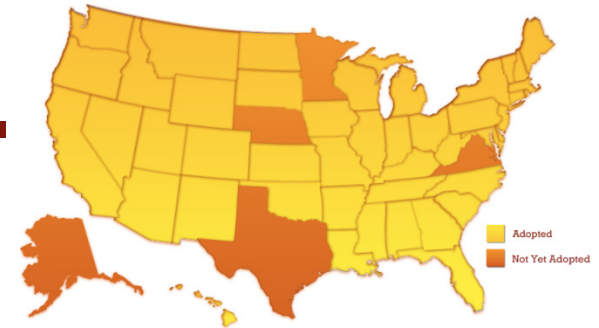


- **Purpose**

- **Standardize instruction from state to state.**
- **Ensure students are able to successfully enter society upon graduation.**
- **Standards are not about meeting the basics but about ensure student learning is being maximized.**
- **Standards guide teachers as they create lessons and enhance student learning.**



Implementation Timeline



- **Beginning of the Standards**
 - ♦ 1st Math and Language Arts Literacy (LAL) guidelines- June 2010
- **Current alignment**
 - ♦ Guidelines now referred to as Common Core State Standards (CCSS)
 - ♦ 45 states and 3 territories have adopted CCSS
- **Future of the Standards**
 - ♦ Aligning CCSS and accountability systems
 - ♦ Two consortium options
 - ▶ **PARCC**
 - ▶ **Smarter Balanced**

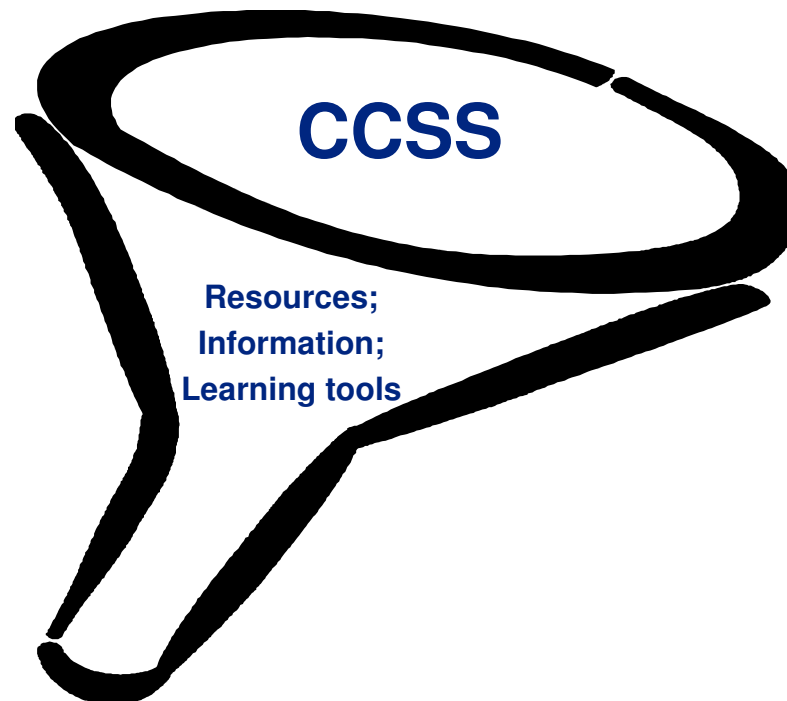

- **Provide hardcopy resources to students, teachers and parents**
 - ◆ **Offer current educational materials**



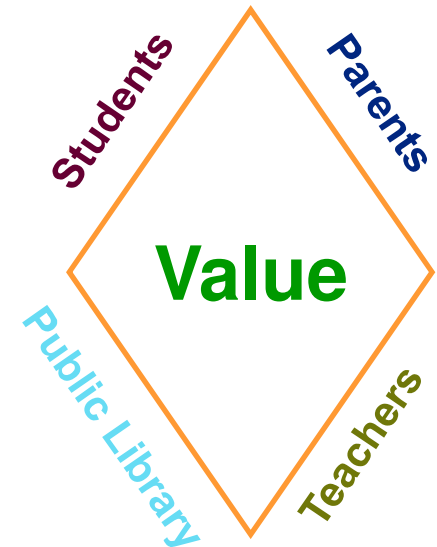
7 Ways Libraries Can Influence Student Learning, cont'd

- **Create teen advisory board**
 - ◆ Keep teens interested in the library; offer volunteer hours
- **Enable social collaboration**
 - ◆ Establish a safe haven for collaboration
- **Offer access to electronic resources**
 - ◆ Provide relevant academic databases

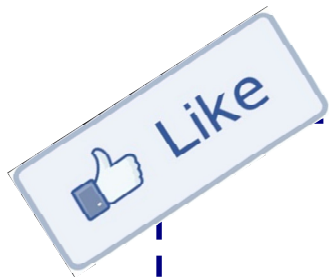
